Refuah Shlemah

The MiSheberach

This is often considered the most traditional prayer for one who is ill. It is usually recited during the Torah service at synagogue. Offering to say it at someone's bedside is also very comforting and healing. The individual's Hebrew name and mother's name are often included in this blessing in the blanks provided .
