Give, Give, Give

It looks as though, during the month of Adar, we are surrounded with the message of giving.

Last Shabbat, just before Adar starts, we read a special section called "Shekalim" from a second Sefer Torah. This special reading told us of the mitzvah of the half shekel or "Mahatzit Hashekel."

When the Jewish people built the Mishkan (the Holy Tabernacle where the tablets of the Ten Commandments were kept, pictured above), each person donated one half shekel to the project. Last week's Torah reading reminded each of us of our on-going responsibility to donate to the community and to support the synagogue.

The name of our parasha this week is "Terumah" which can be defined as "contribution, donation, gift, offering, or endowment." The name continues the theme of giving. Then, ten days later, Purim occurs in the middle of Adar.

We fulfill one of the basic mitzvot of Purim by giving charity to the poor. In fact, unlike other times of the year, when we seek the most effective and anonymous means to donate, on Purim the custom is to give charity to anyone who asks. We give without checking whether the person "really" needs the assistance. And the mitzvot of Mishloah Manot, also known as the Purim gift baskets, and of Seudat Purim, the Purim meal, are also related to giving.

Why is this message of giving so dominant during the month of Adar?

We know the famous halacha that says, "From the moment the month of Adar begins, we increase our joy," or in Hebrew: "mishenichnas addar marbin besimcha." The saying is so well-known it has even become a song. During the month of Adar, rejoicing abounds. Adar is associated with the happiest times for the Jewish nation throughout history.

So, again, what does joy have to do with giving? Well, there is a very powerful message here.

If we want stable, enduring joy; if we want to be happy deep in our heart, to find a happiness that stays with us every day, the kind of happiness that no one and nothing in the future can take away, there is only one way: giving. Nothing else but the act of giving, an act of taking something away from ourselves for the sake of someone else, increases our happiness in this way. Whatever we give, whether it is time, talent, money, kindness, or something else; whatever we give without getting benefit from our gift, increases our happiness and becomes infinite and endless.

This is a spiritual rule that works in the opposite way from physical reality. In fact, from a spiritual perspective, what we keep is what we lose. What we give away is all we really have, in the end. So, give, give, give!

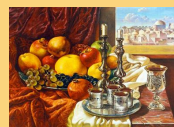
