Dear Members and Friends.


As we look forward to the beginning of our High Holy Days on Wednesday evening, I want to extend my warmest wishes to the entire Kahal Joseph family.

Chon Tachon: An Excerpt from Bat Ahuva

Bat Ahuva opens the prayers of Arvit on the second day of Rosh Hashanah. In it, the Jewish people are compared to a daughter who thought over her transgressions and sins. She gets up early at dawn to pour out her heart's thoughts and pleas before G-d. The description recalls the female speaker in the Song of Songs who seeks after her love in the evenings. There she also arises to look for her love, for forgiveness. In both, the Jewish people turn towards Hashem, their love, and ask: place me as a seal upon Your Heart. In the continuation of the song the young woman disappears. Then the Jewish people are presented as children standing before their father in repentance, hoping for mercy. Have mercy on Your children, they are returning to You, and are standing before you in fear. This is the most famous verse of the song and it opens the prayer on the second evening of Rosh Hashanah. It's interesting that this song both

opens Rosh Hoshanah and concludes the saying of Selihot. It is also sung between Shaharit, the morning prayer, and Mussaf on the second day of Rosh Hashanah when the Torah scroll is returned to the ark. Then the entire congregation stands as one and sings the section of the piyut entitled. "Chon Tachon."

Have mercy on Your children, they are returning to You And with fear, they stand before You

They dread the time when they will be called for their verdict For this reason, they have come before You in [their] pain Bring me close to the year of redemption and pardon me

On the peaceful waters of G-d give me solace

And remember for my benefit the merit [of Jacob] a man of innocence

Place me as a seal upon Your heart

If you keep my transgressions for me as a burden My Rock, my Redeemer, how will I carry on?

I will not be able to bear the weight upon me

Please pardon my wrongdoings
