Finding An Oasis in the Desert

Dear Kahal,

This Shabbat we start the fourth book of the Torah, Bamidbar, which means “in the desert.” The holiday of Shavuot, which celebrates Hashem giving us the Torah, also takes place this week, the same week that we begin Bamidbar. Of course, we received the Ten Commandments and the Torah at Maamad Har Sinai, at Mt. Sinai in the middle of the desert.

Why does Hashem make the desert such an important place, such a dominant theme in our story of becoming a nation? Why do we receive what is essentially our constitution, the laws and rules that govern and guide us, in the desert? There are a few answers to this question. Here is one of them.

The desert is an important place for spiritual growth. When we want to manage our spiritual life, we can only do it when we divide ourselves from others, when we put ourselves in desert of sorts. We separate ourselves from all outside ideas that may influence us, we focus on our thoughts and actions, on what we ourselves do.

For any action we take, any physical activity we perform, focus and concentration help us achieve our goals. These elements—focus and concentration—are even more essential for our spiritual achievement.

To develop spiritually we need to be where nobody can interrupt us, where nobody can change the course we set for ourselves, influencing us with outside thoughts and ideas. We need to free ourselves of intrusions.

That’s why we create a synagogue; that’s why we may set aside places for quiet contemplation in our homes. The desert is just a place that allows us to focus. A person who wants to meditate seeks a place that relaxes him or her, a place that is a sanctuary. Once we know what our spiritual goals are, and have a safe place to pursue them, we can go all the way, follow the course we have set, and nourish and challenge our souls.

During most of our lives, Hashem, HaKadosh Barukh Hu, wants us to live fully, in

Yom Yom Odeh La'El

Selected by Rabbi Hagay Batzri

This piyut was composed anonymously and is sung in the Iraqi Jewish tradition on Shavuot, primarily at the arrival of dawn after "Tikkun Leil Shavuot," the long night of Torah learning held on the eve of Shavuot. It's already not night, and yet it is not quite day either. Similarly, the piyut describes how the Jewish people stood in a suspended state, ready to receive the Torah at Mount Sinai, just before the momentous event. For this reason, the piyut is also sung on Shabbat days when the Ten Commandments are read in Parashat Yitro and Parashat Va'et-hanan.
