

Dancing for Nothing: A Story Retold

Here is a story that a remarkable woman shared with others. I think it's quite a touching story that contains a powerful message, a message that will enlighten our Hanukka and raise us up. Originally it was entitled, "Nissim b'Tel Aviv 2014" or "Miracles in Tel Aviv 2014."

Yesterday I stood at the entry to the maternity ward in Ichilov, the main hospital in northern Tel Aviv. This time, I was at the maternity ward not to give birth, but to visit.

As you know, Tel Aviv is a city associated with many things, but it is not commonly thought of as a religious place. Even though I wore a head covering, as I stood at the door of the ward, a gentle young woman approached me. She was overcome with emotion and asked, "Are you Nurit from Ashira [a women's organization]?"

"Yes," I smiled.

The woman whose name I did not know began telling me, "Ten years I'd been married and had not had any children..."

The clothes she wore poignantly finished her story. She was wearing hospital clothes given to women who had just delivered a baby . . .

She continued, "Last year I heard a lesson given by Rabbanit Yemima about Hanukka and about the importance of praising and thanking G-d in front of the Hanukka candles. Rabbanit Yemima told us that we must thank G-d for what we lack as well as for what we have."

So, of course, I had tears in my eyes as this sweet woman went on with her story.

"My husband and I decided, after we'd tried everything, to take strength and praise Hashem for our lack of children. We found ourselves dancing in front of the Hanukka candles, thanking G-d that we didn't have children."

"During those eight days of Hanukka we travelled to Mea Shearim [the ultra-Orthodox, religious neighborhood in Jerusalem] because Rabbanit Yemima had explained to us the importance of lighting Hanukka candles in a beautiful, shining chanukiya made of polished silver. When we arrived at the store that sold silver goods, we turned around and returned home. The prices were far beyond what we could afford with our budget. "

"The next day, I returned to Mea Shearim. I circled around the store for nearly an hour. In the end I decided to buy the chanukiya on an installment plan. I bought a beautiful silver chanukiya for my husband. When I arrived home, I wrapped it up and put it away on the shelf for next year. "





Light Up Your Life with Hanukkah Candles & Blessings

Families usually light their Hanukkah menorah directly or soon after nightfall. If Hanukkah begins on Shabbat eve, the Hanukkiyah should be lit just before sundown with candles that last until after dark. To light, **place candles in the rightmost position on your menorah**—one for the first night, two for the second, etc.—plus the shamash, the helper candle. Now recite the blessings.

Two Blessing for All Eight Nights of Hanukkah

*Baruch Atah Adonai Eloheinu Melech
HaOlam, asher kidshanu b'mitzvotav
v'tzivanu l'hadlik ner Hanukkah.*

Blessed are You, O Lord Our God, Ruler of the Universe, Who has sanctified us with Your commandments and commanded us to kindle the lights of Hanukkah.

*Baruch Atah Adonai Eloheinu Melech
HaOlam, she'asah nisim l'avoteinu,
ba'yamim hahem ba'zman hazeh.*

Blessed are You, O Lord our God, Ruler of the Universe, Who made miracles for our forefathers in those days at this time.

Third Blessing for First Night Only

This third blessing, Shehekheyanu is only said on the first night of Hanukkah:

*Baruch Atah Adonai Eloheinu Melech
HaOlam, shehekheyanu, v'kiyemanu,
v'higiyanu lazman hazeh.*

Blessed are You, O Lord Our God, Ruler of the Universe, Who has kept us alive, sustained us and brought us to this season.
