Rabbi's Message The Things that Make us Tick

After I graduated from high school 16 years ago, I attended a lovely program of full-time yeshiva studies for 10 months at Yeshivat HaKibbutz HaDati at En Tzurim. This was a spiritually intense time as I enjoyed the opportunity to learn classical rabbinic texts in the land that gave birth to our people.

Out one window was the Shefelah – the Coastal Plain – where Jonah first entered his ship to Tarshish, and where rabbinic Judaism rebuilt itself after the destruction of the Temple. Out the other window were the Judean Hills, where Jerusalem sat tucked among the mountaintops and called with magnetic allure.

This was a year in which I met many new people, forming ongoing connections that I still enjoy today. Just last week I had lunch with my roommate from that time, who also became a rabbi and now works in the Sephardi community in Seattle.

But even some of those whom I haven't seen in the meantime remain ingrained upon my memory. As we read through the story of the Mishkan, how could I possibly forget Ariel, a truck driver from the Deep South who was inspired by the message of Judaism to make a lifelong commitment to Erets Yisrael?



He was a sweet, openhearted man who saved up his extra income from trucking to buy old industrial parts made from precious metals. In his spare time, he would melt them down in a forge, creating stunningly beautiful implements in the style of the Holy Temple. Once a year, he would make a

pilgrimage to Erets Yisrael to donate these items to an organization that dreams of seeing the Mikdash up and running again.

I was awestruck by the genuineness of his vision, and the self-sacrifice that it took for him to do this work. His craftsmanship and religiosity dominated his time and finances, but he did it with a twinkle, a smile, and his charming southern drawl. I can only imagine what he gave up to be able to make this trip once a year, and I was amazed at what this outwardly "regular guy" could do when he put his mind to it.

As we bring Sefer Shemot to a close, may the power of Ariel's example linger in our minds. If you can imagine one thing that could claim your heart in this way, what would it be?

all who attended.


