## Rabbi's Message

Truly this is a week full of blessings! We began it with the sanctification of the moon last Motsa'e Shabbat, when we read these encouraging words from our liturgy:

### ***Keshem she'anu merakedim***

***kenegdekh*** – *“Even if we were to spring forward towards you, O moon, we could not touch you. So too may God cause that if others spring forward against us with ill intent, they will not be able to touch us!”*

After making this fond request, we spent the next few days engaged with the blessings that emerge from our Parasha. No matter how Balak tries to enlist Bilam's help in cursing the Jews, God arranges it so that the Israelites come out even better than when they started. No expense is too lavish, no equipment too difficult to find, no location too remote to stand in the way of Balak's evil design, yet still God's will dominates the story to our benefit.

The crowning moment of this narrative is Bilam's third blessing of *“Ma tobu ohalekha Ya'akob”* – *how goodly are your tents O Jacob*. The special nature of this famous benediction is even written into the very way that we make the Torah Scrolls. I mentioned last week that most of our Sefarim commence all but a handful of columns with the letter Vav, and one of these



very rare exceptions is the Mem of *Ma Tobu*. Thus, even in scrolls where tremendous intellectual energy went into the elevation of the Vav, this blessing gets pride of place at the top for all to see.

On these holy words that look down from above, the Midrash Yelamedenu comments: “Earthly Tents are better than Heavenly Tents. For the Heavenly tents are the source of great failure among mankind: see how many people worship the sun, moon, and stars! Yet the Earthly Tents are so holy that you cannot find a person who would enter into a synagogue and sin.”

This too reminds me of the blessings of last Shabbat, when Michael Amron spoke so movingly of his gratitude at being able to have an honored place in our communal life at the age of 96! When we spread the Tallet over him and Rabbi Bouskila blessed him with the Birkat Kohanim, I saw the inverse of a heart-warming scene from Shabuot when Mordy Cohen blessed the children with the same berakha under a similar tallet canopy. The first was a scene of the founding generation blessing the generation of his grandchildren, while the second was nearly the mirror image: a younger man showing respect to a beloved elder.

Surely this is a fulfillment of the Midrash above: when our synagogue is so full of communal love and serious worship of God, how deeply we feel the power of the Earthly Tents! *Ma tobu ohalekha Ya'akob!*

## Shiba Asar Betamuz

The 17th of Tamuz commemorates several tragic moments in the history of the Jewish people. In our collective memory, it is best known as the day that the walls of Jerusalem fell in the year 70, in the siege that ended with the destruction of the Bet Hamikdash only 3 weeks later on the 9th of Ab.

The day is one of four “minor fasts” that are observed during the daylight hours only. Because it falls on Shabbat this year, it will be observed on Sunday, July 24th.


