Rabbi's Message

As my flight to Israel finished crossing the Atlantic Ocean, an announcement crackled over the PA system. Apparently the backup oxygen unit for the pilot had sprung a leak, and if, *bar minan*,

an emergency were to happen that would force them to rely on it, they would not have enough oxygen left to make it to Ben Gurion.

While AirCanada was talking with the Irish airports to see if they had the right parts, they decided that the best place to go for repairs would be Heathrow Airport in London. We landed in England without incident, and over the next 4 hours the captain and crew kept us up to date about our status.

With plenty of delay to endure, my seatmate and I struck up a conversation that seemed idle at first but developed into something much richer. His name was Michael (101!) and he was going to Israel for the first time ever to help work on Israel's next order of fighter jets for the IDF. As a Protestant Christian who had been adopted from India as a young man, he had the perfect mix of different and similar experiences with me to make for an encounter of real depth.

Ray and the Rabbi became friends when the Rabbi tutored his son for his bar mitzvah, and taught Ray how to read the Torah and Haftarah as well.

Just 18 months ago, Ray was diagnosed with ALS, and decided to ride from San Diego to the Atlantic to raise money and awareness. Although the trip did not go as planned, he raised almost \$80,000 towards a cure.

He died on Monday 8/9, just after celebrating his 57th birthday. After his funeral on Wednesday, over 100 people rode their bicycles from the synagogue to the cemetery in honor of one of Ray's final wishes.

Once we felt close, he revealed to me that his Christianity had helped him through a tough time in his spiritual development. A few years back, he led a hedonistic lifestyle that concentrated on the here and now without a care for what happens tomorrow or who he hurt. "Why should I take responsibility for the failings of my character if God made me flawed?" he thought. Eventually he had a challenging experience that woke him up to the error of this perspective, and it really turned him around. He realized that God had also given him the skills to take control of his weaknesses, and it made him feel so fulfilled when the hard work that this took started to pay off.

I was struck by this, not only because of its honest presentation of mature growth, but because our flight path was such a perfect metaphor for his pathway of teshuva. Here the plane had to stray from its initial destination because the person in the pilot's seat recognized that there was a problem. The seriousness of the issue not only directed the plane off course, but also forced it to ground as the problem became unsupportable. Then it had to be fixed using only the tools and materials on hand, and we had to test and confirm the new unit was working before taking off again.

"What a delightful manifestation of Rambam's Hilkhot Teshuba!" I thought later as I read Shaharit in the aisle of a locked plane on the tarmac. "And what a perfect story for the Shabbat on which the 9th of Ab falls!" The ancient hahamim understood that the Mikdash was destroyed because of *sin'at hinam* – pointless hatred – and the perfect antidote for that is *teshuba shelema* – true repentance.

May the *zekhut* of Michael's metaphor and the story it embodies help us take responsibility for ourselves, and banish *sin'at hinam* from the world. And may Michael keep developing into the wonderful man he is becoming, guiding the Jewish nation to defend itself with the best technology in a hostile world! May we all rise to his high bar of what it means to be a *tsadik*.
