Rabbi's Message

The past few years have seen Planned Parenthood become a regular guest in political headlines. Since abortion is one of the procedures they provide alongside a long list of other women's health services, the ethical implications of giving them public or private support have become the subject of heated debate.

On one hand, many of the services at the heart of Planned Parenthood's mission are not controversial at all. Few would object to the idea of making it easier for women to be screened for various types of cancer, receive treatment for sexually transmitted diseases, or have affordable access to pregnancy tests.

On the other hand, there is deep division in the religious and secular worlds about the morality of contraception, abortion, and using fetal tissue for medical research, all of which can happen through Planned Parenthood. Some have argued that even supporting a benevolent act like cancer screening with Planned Parenthood is implicitly helping it provide these other services.

In 2011 and again in 2015, activists working from this perspective were caught using deceptive methods to directly harm Planned Parenthood. In both incidents, undercover videos were shot of actors trying to get Planned Parenthood workers to give them unethical advice or agree to participate in illegal acts. When the videos were

released to the public, it reignited the abortion debate and led Congress to consider defunding the organization entirely.

In the aftermath, both sets of videos were found to have left out key information affecting the morality of what was shown, or even to have been deliberately faked. The most favorable reading is that they were distorted in a calculated bid to turn public feelings against Planned Parenthood.

Yet if we enter into the perspective of the pro-life activists, this could theoretically be a moral form of deception. At the time, ethical writers about both incidents pointed to Parashat Shemot as a possible test case. When Pharaoh commanded Shifra and Pu'a to kill all the Israelite baby boys. they lied quite elaborately to avoid participating in murder. If you sincerely believe that abortion is murder, it might well be an act of mercy to nonviolently sabatoge the funding source of an abortion provider.

As a rabbi. I can understand this perspective on a theoretical level but I cannot endorse it on a practical level. The primary difference between the videos and the story in Shemot is that Shifra and Pu'a lie to avoid a royal order to personally and directly murder someone in a very clear moral case, while the activists did not even work at Planned Parenthood, and a universal moral assessment of abortion may never come about. In the end, winning hearts and minds is best done with integrity and transparency, and any ethical argument will stand the longest if it is made by telling the truth.

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


