Dear Members:


It has been an amazing privilege to preside over Kahal Joseph these past 6 years. I have worked to live

## PURIM TORAH THE HALAKHOT OF SUPERHEROES

(ADAPTED FROM A TESHUVA BY RABBIYOSSI SIROTE)

The X-Men franchise's new hit is just the latest reminder of how many superheroes are Jewish. Magneto, Shadowcat, The Thing, Colossal Boy – so many that a full Wikipedia page is devoted to simply listing them all. Few people may think about it, but their special abilities lead to some profound questions in halakha, of which we share three in honor of Purim.

### 1. CAN A SUPERHERO WITH THE POWER TO MULTIPLY HIMSELF COUNT MORE THAN ONCE IN A MINYAN?

The Shulhan Arukh rules that when one of the ten men in a minyan falls asleep, he can still be considered part of the asara (OH 55:6). However, since this is not allowed a priori for more than one person, our multiplying superhero could only bring a count of 8 up to 10 with himself and one double.

### 2. IF YOU HAD EIGHT ARMS, HOW WOULD YOU PUT ON TEFILLIN?

Based on a passage in Deuteronomy, the Talmud infers that the dominant hand binds the Tefillin on its less gifted mate (Menahot 37a, Deut. 6:8-9). Extending that logic to its natural conclusion, our well-armed superhero should use the hand he writes with to tie the Tefillin on his weakest arm.

### 3. HOW SHOULD A SUPERHERO APPROACH THE VIOLATION OF SHABBAT TO SAVE A LIFE?

The Talmud rules that if a sick person could be saved by eating two figs, and it happened that there was one branch with three figs and two each with one fig, it is best to break Shabbat only one time by picking the branch with three figs (Menahot 64a-b). The conclusion for our superhero is that Shabbat can indeed be violated to save a life, but it is ideally best to limit the violation as much as is reasonably possible.
