

# KOL MEVASSER

#### Rabbi's Message

From the time of my own bar mitsva until I finished college, I tutored a lot of bene mitsva students. I loved to teach skills that opened synagogue participation to people who weren't that much



As the big day approached, I would take each student on one or more trips to read from the actual Torah scroll that would be used during their service. It's one thing to practice from a book in the comfort of your home, and quite another to use the real Sefer in the open space of the synagogue. Despite its intimidation factor, my students would get excited – it made the whole event seem tangible and real.

Sometimes, though, even these little milestones can take an interesting turn. One of my students had this week's parasha, Behar-Behukotai, and we had just reached Vayikra 27:13. He read "ve'im ga'ol yig'alenu..." when I interrupeted: "yig'alena – we're talking about a she!" Undaunted, my student jabbed the yad at the parchment and declared, "Well, it says yig'alenu in the Torah!"

Incredulously, I followed the *yad* to the offending word, where I was astonished to see that he was correct! I showed him the *yig'alena* in my print Humash, and then, to make sure, we checked the five other Sifrei Torah in the Ekhal. Sure enough, it was *yig'alena* in all of them except for ours! With an odd mixture of duty and remorse, we informed the Gabbai that the sefer was pasul,

and my student chose a different scroll to use at his celebration.

How had no one noticed this mistake? The scroll had been used regularly in Czechoslovakia before WWII, and when the Nazis failed to destroy it, the Memorial Scrolls Trust repaired it and dispatched it to the synagogue in Champaign, Illinois. Not only had the original sofer made an error, but the Memorial Scrolls Trust sofer had not noticed it either! Could it really be that a college kid and a 12-year-old were the first to see it?!

Perhaps we found it precisely because we were young and inexperienced, looking at the Torah with new eyes. We had fewer preconceived notions, giving us the freedom to say something about the scroll that was very important. And once we did notice the problem, it gave us a whole new perspective on human error in an area that we had taken for granted before.

The most important lesson, however, might be learned from the community's response. Understandably, the historic scroll held a special place in the congregation, and there was a lot of sadness that the scroll could no longer be used. But the experience made them realize that they had an opportunity to reassess their whole collection and ensure a future where there was always more than one kosher Sefer available for their divine worship. After a meaningful deliberation, they decided that the best way to do this was to commission a brand new Sefer Torah in honor of the Czech scroll that was being retired. With any luck, the new scroll will be used in the congregation for another 150 years, serving through many semahot and community events. May God grant that all our mistakes be rectified in such beautiful, constructive ways!
