Rabbi's Message

If something is funny, we remember it. There might be other professionals who said it better, or who captured more perspectives or nuance, but the people who most reliably get us to retain information are the comedians.



A case in point in British humorist Peter Kay's bit on misheard song lyrics. While Kay likely did not have Parashat Shelah in mind as he wrote this material, he caused me to understand the story of the 10 Spies in a way that I might never have experienced otherwise. He may not be a Torah scholar, but he has still produced one of the best illustrations of the psychology of the spies that I have ever encountered.

The premise of the bit is that Kay has recently been to a karaoke bar. Unlike most other forms of music consumption, karaoke requires a song's lyrics to be displayed on a screen, and this causes him to realize that he has been singing the words to famous songs incorrectly for much of his adult life.

To make his case to the audience, he brings out a smartphone and plays the songs into his mic for them to judge. First up is Sister Sledge's We Are Family, in which Kay claims an important refrain is "just want to staple the vicar." He then plays it, and the hall erupts with laughter as it appears that this is the only possible way to hear the words. Later, he claims that Michael Jackson's You Are Not Alone includes the phrase "your burgers are the best," with similarly riotous results.

Kay's audience knows the original songs, and is well aware that the true lyrics are "just want to state for the record" and "your burdens I will bear."
But through the power of suggestion, he is able to
twist our minds in such a way that we are primed
in advance to mishear them, or even to forget
what we already knew about the words.

Had he played the songs first and then said the distorted phrases, it would have clashed with our lived-in experience and we would not have accepted it. At best he would come across as a bumbling fool, funny because he must navigate a reality so opposed to our own. Rather, his magic lies in the fact that he told us what he heard beforehand. With the wrong words ringing in our ears, we are primed to hear the songs in the same distorted way that he did, cracking up because we ourselves have garbled the words of a song we have heard correctly a thousand times before.

This power of suggestion is exactly the issue with the 10 Spies. Though they have positive report of the physical qualities of the Land of Kena'an, they prime the Israelites to defeatism before they have time to judge the issue for themselves. From 10 influentially placed individuals, anguish spreads like wildfire through the encampment, turning their hearts away from God at a moment that the rest of their experience should have assured them would be a triumph.

It takes a special kind of strength to stand up like Joshua and Caleb and remind our fellows that we can actually rise above the hype. Suggestion is no more threatening than our ability to get carried away by it, and that is something that we can master with time and openness to maturation. In the meantime, if we do fall under its sway, may it be for something no more consequential than Michael Jackson's dinner menu.
