Rabbi's Message Status of Jerusalem

Wednesday was a truly historic day. Even at my young age of 35 I thought that I would not live to see the US make any meaningful declarations about the status of Jerusalem. It was a surreal moment to hear those unbelievable words from President Trump:



"I have determined that it is time to officially recognize Jerusalem as the capital of Israel. While previous presidents have made this a major campaign promise, they failed to deliver. Today, I am delivering. I've judged this course of action to be in the best interests of the United States of America and the pursuit of peace between Israel and the Palestinians... That is why, consistent with the Jerusalem Embassy Act, I am also directing the State Department to begin preparation to move the American embassy from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem."

There is poetry to this announcement being made the week of Parashat Vayesheb, when Yosef first tasted the intense skepticism that his unconventional visions were even plausible. "What sort of dream is this?!" his father asked. "Did you really expect that it would ever come to pass?! Yosef lived for decades before the events turned all reasonable expectations on their head and proved him right. To be precise, 22 years passed between his first dream and its fulfillment, the exact same amount of time that elapsed

between the Jerusalem Embassy Act of 1995 and the President's announcement in 2017.

If nothing else, Trump's abrupt reversal of longstanding policy precedent commands attention. Reaction has ranged from the full-throated approval of Jewish intellectuals like Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks to the ire of world leaders predicting blowback from Palestinian supporters. No matter what side people are on, everyone is talking about it.

Only a few days after the announcement, the jury is still out on how destabilizing this move will actually be. In Israel this week, there have been clashes with the Palestinians, but a deep judgment can only be made by examining the long-term consequences, which we don't yet know. The same can be said of other parts of the world where Jewish synagogues and businesses have been vandalized: it is a regrettable secondary outcome of the announcement, but the wideangle lens will be the one to reveal the policy's lasting legacy.

Ultimately, this will also be a significant test case for the integrity of the United Nations. As an idea, it has extremely noble goals: promoting peace, enhancing relations between countries, and solving international problems. As an organization that operates in the real world, it is as flawed as its constituent parts, with a track record that has not always lived up to its ideals. How will this vital but imperfect forum handle the recent shake-up? It has long given a platform for actual ethnic cleansers to tar Israel with a brush that they themselves have wielded. Let's see how it responds when the tables are turned.

Professor Nadia Malinovich Saturday, January 6, 2018



Professor Malinovich received her bachelors in History from Oberlin College and her PhD in History from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. After a Post-doctoral Fellowship at New York University, she began teaching in France.

Now an Associate Professor of American Studies at the Universite Picardie-Jules Verne, she has a special interest in French Jewish History, about which she has written extensively.

Her current project is an exploration of the lives of graduates of the Alliance Israelite Universelle schools in the Middle East and North Africa, both pre- and post-immigration to France, Canada and the United States.



Did you or your parents attend an Alliance Israelite Universelle school in the Middle East or North Africa?

In addition to speaking at Kahal, Dr. Nadia Malinovich will be in Los Angeles from January 5 to 13 to conduct in-person interviews with people who graduated from the Alliance Israelite Universelle schools in the Middle East or Africa.

In collaboration with the AIU Library in Paris and the Sephardi Federation in New York, she has already completed 40 interviews in Paris & Montreal. Now, she looks to the Los Angeles community.
