Rabbi's Message

When I was in grad school at Yeshiva University, I took a chance on a class about the academic study of Kabbala. It was a significant reach from my comfort zone, but the professor was welcoming and won me over.



One day after lecture, we were talking about the song Adon Olam, and he was surprised to hear that Sephardim have more verses than the version he knew. In particular he was drawn to the phrase "Beli Hibur" – God is neither composed of parts nor separable into parts. His instant reaction was that the line was responding to the Kabbalistic concept of "Sefirot." In this mystical theory of the universe, the One God can be thought of as having ten distinct "emanations," each with unique qualities that can be studied and appreciated separately.

At first glance, this is a beautiful message about how to understand the spiritual world around us. It infuses our religious life with new potential meaning as we try to determine which Emanation is expressed in each of the commandments we fulfill. Just think of the Iraqi seder plate (pictured to the right), which is arranged so that each item in the seder represents one of the 10 Emanations. As we move through the meal, it is so compelling to feel that our progression is reflecting the true order of the cosmos!

Yet the risk of the theory of Emanations is that it could sound like we think there are 10 different gods. Yikes! The line "Beli Hibur" seems to be a corrective for this: in a community that values the mystical truths of the Sefirot, we have a duty

to emphasize that God is still the indivisible One God of our holy Shema. By deeply internalizing the message of "Beli Hibur," we would preserve the freedom to push our boundaries with Kabbala because our main principles will be safeguarded. If the Iraqi seder plate can help us do this, then may this year be one of renewed spiritual achievements!


