A celebration of someone's life can ring truest in the words of those who loved him. I thank Dr. Yaakov Elman's student. Akiva Weisinger, for his moving remarks (minorly edited) - Rabbi Melhado



So, Professor Elman. I am not gonna do this man justice, but I'm gonna trv.

Professor Elman had an absolutely bonkers origin story: going to Chaim Berlin and being close to Rav Hutner; then getting a degree in meteorology(?!), then Assyriology when, in his words, there was no market for a 24/6 weatherman; then transitioning to a book clerk who became so well known among academics as a hidden gem they got together and helped send him to NYU for a PhD, whereupon he invented an entire new field of academic study centered on understanding the Talmud in its Persian context. He was the coolest person I ever met. I think he never forgot how good it felt to be discovered, to be found as a diamond in the rough, and he actively looked to do the same for his students.

I cannot overstate how insanely brilliant he was. If you asked him any question about anything in Shas, he would give you not just the answer but every single time it appeared, which page, which line. You wouldn't believe me, which is why I tried it a couple of times. It's all true, guys.

As an outspoken believer in academic scholarship and liberal politics, he did not get the

respect he deserved from YU students. who were no doubt confused by this very frum-looking man asking "what is wrong with Republicans?" I recall a student challenging him on a point about the Tosefta, saving the Rambam said differently. Dude, Professor Elman wrote the book on the Tosefta. Come on.

If you impressed him, well, he was the best mentor you could ask for. Not only was he encouraging, but he took you seriously. One of the highlights of my life so far is when I sent him an interpretation of a piece of R. Hutner, and not only was he impressed by it, he sent it around to other academics so that I made it into a widely circulated newsletter of academic Jewish stuff, and he also came into class with printed versions of my blogpost and had me teach the class(!). A lot of the eulogies have said that he was particularly encouraging towards women in the field of Jewish academia. helping them and amplifying their work in what is a difficult field. I am very unsurprised. Professor Elman was about the truth, and if you had it, he didn't care who were you were: young. old, man, woman, frum, not frum.

He also was a good exemplar of someone who was a serious Scholar who didn't take himself too seriously. Whether it was bringing a real axe into his Intro to Bible class to demonstrate what "ben enekha" meant, or including Calvin and Hobbes comics in his syllabuses, or the cracking of a joke or a retelling of a good yarn, there was real joy in all that he did.

The world was a much more interesting. passionate, joyful place for his presence in it.

While organizing the parokhets at Kahal, Rabbi Melhado found a lovely tribute to a member of the Levi family. The cloth, originally used to cover the Torah between aliyot, is a dark green with metalic embroidery.

## The text reads:

This Parokhet is for the peaceful elevation of the cherished soul of Rahel Khatoon, may her spirit rest in Paradise, wife of Mr. Ezra Khedoorie ben Eliyahu Ezra Halevi, may God give him life and strength. She was born on Wednesday, the 27th of Av in the year 5657, and passed to her eternal rest on Tuesday evening, the 10th of Heshvan in the year 5679, aged 21 years, 2 months, and 13 days. May she be bound up in the bond of life.

The 100th anniversary of Rahel Khatoon's passing will be on Oct. 19, 2018. The extended Levi family plans to preserve and frame the cloth to put it up in Kahal.
