Rabbi's Message

When I was in rabbinical school, an Ashkenazi institution that met only during the week, we shared our Bet Midrash with a Sephardi minyan that met only on Shabbat. Whenever we were present, they were absent, and vice versa.



One week, our student Gabbai noticed that the Sephardim had mistakenly left their Torah scroll in the Ekhal and forgotten to return ours. With startling urgency, he insisted that they be switched immediately, so that not even a single aliva in our minyan would be read from a Sephardi Sefer. I was insulted, and told him so to his face. In reply, I received the astonishing argument that because of a dispute about how to spell a single word in Parashat Ki Tetse ("daka" in Deut. 23:2 ending in Alef or Hey), Sephardim and Ashkenazim should never read from one another's Sefarim!

I am happy to report that the incident was mediated to an acceptable truce, and this colleague remains a friend. Still, I reject his framing of the issue, and recommend a welcoming stance in which Sephardim and Ashkenazim accept each other's scrolls as kosher. Indeed, the Grace Mussry and Yaakov Levy Scrolls at Kahal Joseph are Ashkenazi, and we have read from both in our services with my blessing.

Modern Torah Scrolls are surprisingly identical, and it is actually amazing that the word "daka" would be the only major difference in spelling. Despite the Jews being spread over thousands of miles and many divergent legal traditions, our Torah is the same. As we enter the High Holy Day season, let us stay focused on what unites us and not get lost in the small differences.
