## KJ HAPPENINGS

#### Rabbi's Message

Shalom,

In this week's parasha, the Torah says:

"And the Lord will set you at the head, and

not at the tail, and you will be only at the top, and you will not be at the bottom, if you obey the commandments of the Lord, your God, which I am commanding you this day to observe to fulfill."

The Ben Ish Chai comments on this verse. Two names that our nation has been called are 'Jacob' and 'Israel,' and there is the letter 'yud' in each name. Since the name of 'Israel,' also pronounced 'Yisrael,' is at a higher spiritual level, this is the name that we will be called in Messianic times.

'Yisrael' is spelled with 'Yud Lerosh' which means 'yud is at the beginning.' Literally, 'yud' is the first Hebrew letter in 'Yisrael.' The phrase, 'Yud Lerosh,' suggests a level of godliness which is higher than nature and which overpowers it.

In comparison, 'Jacob' or 'Yaakov' suggests 'Yud at the heel.' Even though the Hebrew name 'Yaakov' is also spelled with the letter



'yud' at the beginning, and so physically begins with 'yud,' the meaning of the name refers to the root word 'heel' which is a part of the foot. Because of that root meaning, 'Yaakov' signifies God's energy as it manifests in our physical world and nature, and it is associated with being ruled by nature.

These two names for the Jewish people help us to understand the verse we are looking at from our parasha in another light, with greater depth. When the verse conveys that 'Hashem will place you at the head,' what does it mean?

The verse shows us that when we connect with God, then we are elevated to the highest plains of spirituality and become partners with Him in creation. When we connect with God, we are elevated to the level of 'Yisrael', which signifies the depth of our potential, spiritual power as a people.

Understanding the power of connecting with God helps us manifest our spiritual potential in the present, physical world. The integration of our deep spirituality with our physical deeds creates a dwelling place for the highest levels of godliness in our physical realm. This is one of the foundational tenets of Judaism.

May we be blessed with good health and success in all our endeavors!
