Rabbi's Message

Shalom, This week's parasha is named Hayei Sarah which means "the life of Sarah." This seems to be an interesting name for the parasha, as it begins by recounting her death, Abraham's acquisition of her burial plot and her burial.

The Zohar has a passage which illustrates some of Sarah's greatness. "Eve came to this world and was defiled by the snake (who caused her to sin) thus bringing death to her husband and the world. Noah tried to rectify Eve's sin but became drunk and was defiled. Sarah was able to rectify Eve's sin as was seen when she and Abraham went down to Egypt and left unharmed. Sarah brought abundant blessings for her husband and her offspring forever. She had the power to descend into darkness and rise up.'

If we take a closer look at the parasha, we are able to see Sarah's strong impact even after her passing. Abraham realizes he is getting older, and he hasn't married off Isaac. Thus he makes his servant Eliezer take an oath to go to Abraham's family to find a wife for his son. Under no circumstances is Eliezer to find a wife for Isaac among the daughters of the land.

Abraham understands that Isaac needs a special wife in order to continue the great legacy that would be the birth of our nation. This leads to Eliezer finding Rebeccah, Abraham's greatniece, and bringing her back to Isaac.

Our Sages say there were three miracles associated with Sarah's tent. There was a cloud surrounding it continuously which represented G-d's divine presence that was drawn down by Sarah's purity and holiness. Her Shabbat candles would stay lit the entire week. Her bread always stayed fresh. These miracles ceased taking place once she passed on.

When Isaac brings Rebeccah to his mother's tent, these three miracles start to happen again, and this is the sign that she is a worthy successor as the next matriarch for our nation.

Abraham is about to pass on towards the end of the parasha. He calls together all his sons who were born after Isaac and sends them away during his lifetime, so there shouldn't be any confusion as to who is his main son and inheritor. Once again we see the power of Sarah's influence on Abraham in the recognition that he has to make this difficult decision for the guaranteed success of his son and the future of our nation.

The Torah then describes the burial of Abraham when he passed on. It says that Isaac was at the head, with Yishmael behind him. Yishmael had backed down from his previous claims of being greater than Isaac and realized that Isaac was the main progeny and inheritor of Abraham. All of this was made possible through the strength, wisdom and foresight of our first matriarch, Sarah.

May we all be blessed with this strength and wisdom to make the right decisions for ourselves and our families. Amen.
