Rabbi's Message

Shalom. We finished reading the book of Exodus last Shabbat. It discusses the details of the Sanctuary's construction: how the



Sanctuary was erected and how the Divine Presence came to dwell in it and within each of us. The Sanctuary began its function as the "Tent of Meeting" of G-d and man: the place that is the focus of man's efforts to serve G-d, the site where Hashem communicated with us and made His presence felt within a humanly constructed abode.

The story continues this Shabbat in the parasha of 'Vayikra.' Hashem calls out to Moses from the Tent of Meeting

The Hebrew word 'Vayikra,' which means ' and He called' has an anomaly. The last letter, *alef*, is written smaller than usual. This unusual *alef* teaches us about Moshe. Although he recognized his greatness, he remained 'small' in his own eyes, thinking if someone else had been blessed with the spiritual gifts with which he had been blessed, they surely would have achieved far more than himself. In the Torah, Hashem calls Moshe the 'humblest person on the face of this earth.'

In contrast, Adam's name is spelled with an oversize *alef*. Adam was 'the handiwork of G-d.' G-d attested that Adam's wisdom was greater than that of the angels. However, Adam was highly aware of his own greatness. His pride caused him to overestimate himself and led to his downfall through the sin of the Tree of Knowledge.

In life, we have a task, a way of serving Hashem. We should feel happy for who we are, yet not err on the side of arrogance.
