# Rabbi's Message

Shalom,

This week's parasha starts with the commandment to Aharon to light the Menorah twice daily.



The Torah uses the word "beha'alotcha," from "to elevate," to describe lighting the candles. This teaches us that Aharon had to raise up and light each candle until it could light on its own without his aid. There is a pertinent lesson for us here.

"The soul of a person is a candle of Hashem." When we help another physically or spiritually, whether that person is family, a friend, or someone else in the world, we are truly lighting up their soul. Just as Aharon would kindle the flame until it was able to light on its own, so too when we are helping someone else, we should endeavor to help them become self-sufficient and able to stand on their own—able to create their own light.

We should empower them so much that they no longer rely on our aid. The last few months have shown us how interdependent we are on each other. No matter our situation, we need the help and care of others in our lives. We have seen how seemingly small acts of kindness are so important to others. A phone call. An email. Sending someone flowers. As the saying goes, "It's the thought that counts."

In the middle of winter, we light the menorah on Chanukah in remembrance of the miracle of the oil. We light the menorah when it's dark, because "What is the benefit of a candle in daylight?"

In a time of brightness and light, there is not such a great need for these candles to be lit. Specifically in the time of darkness and difficulty, we need to light the candles of souls...
