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Rabbi's Message

Shalom,

This week's Parasha discusses the commandment, or mitzvah, of preparing the red heifer. This is one of the most abstract



mitzvot in the Torah. It is also very relevant to the time we are in.

This commandment and its processes relate to ritual purity. Purity is connected to becoming clean from something which is impure or unclean, something which negatively affects our ability to engage in life. We need purity in order to attain holiness. Holiness involves removing something from its original level and sanctifying it, elevating it. Holiness leads us to closeness with G-d. In addition, purity is something that can't be seen or perceived with our physical eyes. Nevertheless, it helps us guard our beings and bodies on a physical level.

This process of creating and protecting ritual purity can be better understood by considering how we protect our health around Covid-19. The virus is something we cannot tangibly see or feel, yet it has such a powerful influence in the way we live our lives. We are highly aware of its existence with our mind and with our entire being. Some are more susceptible to it than others. Yet we must all keep a vigilant watch.

The Zohar shares that the mitzvah of the red heifer relates to the process of breaking down the power of spiritual confusion, negative judgment, and evil in the world. There are times when the forces of evil are stronger than others. During these challenging periods, we need the energy of the red heifer. Hashem knew that we wouldn't be able to physically fulfill this mitzvah at all times in history. However, by reading and studying about this mitzvah, we are able to draw down the spiritual effects of the commandment into whatever situation we may find ourselves in.

Hashem calls the mitzvah of the Red Heifer, '*Chukat Hatorah*,' or 'the decree of the Torah.' This mitzvah is a law that we are incapable of understanding; it is

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beyond the comprehension of our intellect. Even King Solomon, *Shlomo HaMelech*, who was the wisest of all men couldn't comprehend this mitzvah.

This week's parasha also discusses the passing of Miriam and Aharon.
