Rabbi's Message

In this week's Parasha, Moshe requests Hashem to appoint a leader for Israel. Since he was close to passing away, Moshe says: 'May Hashem, the G-d of



all spirits for all beings, appoint a leader for the nation."

This is a powerful story with many lessons connected to Moshe's entire existence.

We see that even close to his passing, Moshe is unconcerned for himself. He is thinking only of the nation's needs. A truly great leader is a person who is given over to the most important needs of those they are leading. They are truly concerned with the bigger picture. This is their driving force and reason for being. Their great love of Hashem binds them deeply to the nation.

All creations are the handiwork of Hashem. If we love Hashem, we love all of his creations. Indeed, leaders are concerned with all life forms and beings. Moshe calls Hashem, "The G-d of all spirits." He is saying, Hashem you know the spirit of all beings and their ultimate needs. Please appoint a leader who can lead them in ways corresponding to all their vital needs.

A leader is an intermediary between Hashem and the nation. Leaders are in the middle and thus are finely attuned to the needs of the nation and what is the true will of Hashem. A leader knows the people intimately, and thus is deeply devoted to what is most important for their ultimate wellbeing. By being very connected to G-d, the leader also knows what is important in the big picture and conveys this to the nation.
