Rabbi's Message

Shalom,



Parashat Masei speaks about the 42 journeys the children of Israel made in their 40 years in

the desert. The Zohar explains their journeying in a very powerful way: "Hashem led you in the strong and intense desert." The spiritual energy of the desert was connected to the power of the opposite of good in this world—the power of the 'other side' which is opposed to Hashem's will.

Set against the will of this negative force, the people of Israel travelled in the desert in order to diminish its power. To a certain degree, they removed the energy of the negative spirit from the world. If they would have acted on a higher level, their mission would have been accomplished faster. Unfortunately, at times they didn't follow Hashem's path and this allowed the negative situation to continue for longer, since they strengthened the side of negativity when they fell under its dominion.

The power of holiness of creation is connected to the supernal, divine faith of Hashem. When we uplift ourselves along this path, we are connected to the source of energy which sustains all of creation. And, this holy spiritual level is connected to the holy land, the land of Israel. And there, this holiness is reflected within the Holy of Holies, the inner sanctuary within the Temple in Jerusalem, the Bet HaMikdash.

Even during this time when we don't have the Temple physically, in its spiritual merit the whole world is sustained energetically. The energy of the Temple is connected to the needs of all living beings. This connection exists even when we live outside of the holy land.
