Rabbi's Message

This week's Torah portion Ki Tetzei discusses the procedure of war: "When you will go out



to war on your enemy and Hashem your god will deliver him in your hands and you take his captives". The Torah is giving us directives on how we should approach 'war'. The Hebrew words translate as "upon (or over)your enemy." Our perception should be we are 'above' the enemy. Then we can approach the war certain of our victory. The Torah explicitly states that any soldier who has fear of the war and fighting should 'go home in order that he may not strike fear into the hearts of his brothers and not make their hearts melt as his'. We must have confidence in Hashem that he will protect us in battle.

Although the Torah is talking about war on a physical level, it is also referring to the spiritual and mental battle we all experience by living in a body. It is the way of the world that we face challenges and difficulties in life. This is what makes us grow. When we leave our comfort zone is when we grow the most. This is when we learn and experience new life lessons we didn't know before.

Why does spirituality and growth have to be full of effort, rising and falling, and challenges? When we receive benefit without the effort this is called the bread of shame. When we toil for something valuable and important this gives us extra appreciation for it. We know how much effort its attainment requires. The inverse of this can be found in the classic tale of the spoiled child who doesn't appreciate all his wealth and riches and squanders them away since he doesn't truly value how difficult the accumulation of all this wealth truly is. Hashem desires the opposite for us.

This world is beautiful and chaotic at the same time. Creation is perfect yet open to chance as well. We are not in control of the world around us. As conscious human beings, we endeavor to aspire to and live by a higher standard.
