In this week's Parasha, the
Torah speaks of Noah:
"These are the offspring of
Noah, Noah was a
righteous man; he was perfect in his generations;
Noah walked with God."




Why does the Torah give a description of Noah instead of giving us the names of his children? This teaches us that the "offspring" of righteous people are their deeds and actions. As the saying goes, "you're going to reap what you sow."

Our life's impact and actions are what we leave behind in this realm. A righteous person brings blessing upon themselves, their families, and those close to them, and ultimately the entire world.

Noah was surrounded by evil people, yet he walked with Hashem. Since Noah lived in a bad generation it was a challenge for him to maintain his service of Hashem. This shows his greatness. He pushed himself to be good despite the challenging circumstances.

Nevertheless, Noah's righteousness is based on his existence in such an evil generation. Some commentators say that if he had lived in Abraham's generation, he would not have been considered righteous. Indeed, Noah's merit wasn't strong enough to save the world from the flood.
