Jacob's saga continues in this week's parasha. He is returning home after

a long stay with Lavan. He knows he must face his brother Eisav in a long-anticipated reunion.

Although Jacob has hoped Eisav will improve his ways, Eisav has not changed in all these years. He still holds a grudge towards Jacob for taking the birthright and blessings, and he is journeying with 400 men together with him, suggesting that Eisav has ill intentions towards Jacob.

Jacob prepares several manners for approaching and, if needed, coping with Eisav. He prepares for battle. He sends gifts to Eisav to appease him. He prays to Hashem.

The Torah is clear in its directives. We live in an unpredictable world filled with chance happenings and unknown variables. Certain situations demand that we think of all possible outcomes and occurrences. We

must be thorough in everything we are occupied with. This helps us plan and do everything in our power to reach an optimal, desired result.

Nevertheless, we should remember that no matter how much hard work we put into achieving something, we still need Hashem's help to succeed in our endeavors. Jacob's preparations teach us this. Although he did everything in his power to succeed in a natural way, he also prayed to Hashem.

The Torah uses the words 'malachim' for the messengers Jacob sends Eisav. Some commentaries suggest that he literally sent angels to Eisav, perhaps to intimidate Eisav. This was also the intent behind Jacob's message to Eisav: 'I lived with Lavan for twenty years.' Lavan was famous as a powerful sorcerer. Although he tried to harm Yaakov, he wasn't successful...

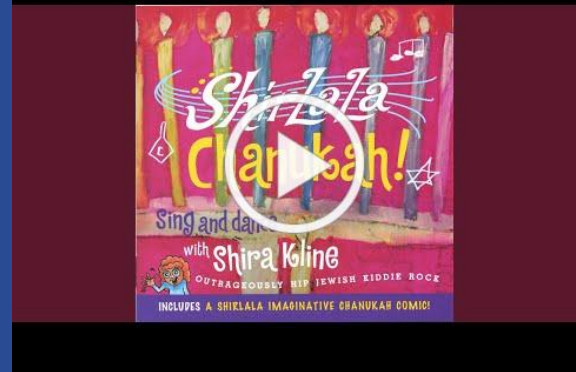

Annual Commemoration – Displacement of Jews from Arab Lands

On June 23, 2014 the Knesset adopted a law which designates November 30th as an annual, national day of commemoration for the 850,000 Jewish refugees who were displaced from Arab countries and Iran in the 20th century.

Jews had lived in the Arab lands for thousands of years, and many of their communities preceded the advent of Islam. But in the 20th century, with the rise of Arab nationalism and the conflict in Palestine, the new Arab regimes began a campaign of massive violations of the rights of their Jewish citizens. Arab states expropriated property of their native Jews, and denaturalized, expelled, arrested, tortured and murdered many of them.

In light of recent global protests in support of Palestinians, it is critical that we make our voices heard within and outside the Jewish community concerning the imbalance of reporting and lack of accountability and acknowledgment of past injustices towards Jewish citizens of Arab countries.

Our program will include addresses from distinguished speakers, witness accounts, a short film clip, and a memorial prayer for those Jews buried in Arab lands. **This event will be hosted at the synagogue and also available on Zoom.** Refreshments will be served at the end of the evening.
