Rabbi's Message

This week's parasha is the pinnacle of our nation's departure from Egypt. Pharaoh himself drove us out, as he was so overwhelmed with the

finality of the last plague that he finally gave up. However, very soon after having let Israel leave, Pharaoh and the Egyptians regretted making this decision. Egypt began a chase with the entire army to force the return of Israel to slavery.

As the children of Israel stood at the Sea, they saw Egypt's army amassing behind them. They were extremely terrified. Although, they had been experiencing freedom from slavery for a year and had witnessed all the plagues that had taken place to create their liberation, a big part of them was still connected to the slave mentality. It's not so easy getting rid of an attitude or identity when one has been subjected to slavery for as long as they had been in Egypt.

Confronted with the Egyptian army's pursuit, different groups among the nation had differing opinions about what they should do in the situation. One faction wanted to commit suicide by jumping in the Sea. Another faction wanted to return to Egypt and the familiarity of slavery. A third faction wanted to fight against the Egyptians. A fourth faction thought prayer to G-d was their best option.

Moshe answered all of these groups with this verse: "Don't be afraid, Stand firm and see Hashem's salvation that He will wreak for you today, for the way you have seen the Egyptians is [only] today, [but] you shall no longer continue to see them for eternity. The Lord will fight for you, but you shall remain silent."

In other words, Moshe was advising the people of Israel, 'Stand still, and don't jump in the sea! You will never see the Egyptians again after today, and you aren't returning to Egypt and slavery! Hashem will fight for you, and there is no need for you to fight against them! Be silent, and don't pray at this moment!'

Hashem then said to Moshe "Speak to the children of Israel, and tell them to travel onward."

Although they had left Egypt, the people of Israel's true liberation didn't occur until the splitting of the Sea. Hashem was pushing us in the direction of the Sea and away from Egypt and all that it represented for a reason.


