Shalom Uvracha,

The name of our parasha, *Tazria*, refers to a woman who has conceived and given birth. Immediately

after discussing that situation, the Torah discusses

the skin disease known as tzara'at. This supernatural disease afflicted those who spoke negatively of others. Like a mold or fungus, tzara'at could even afflict furniture and homes in an effort to alert a person to the negativity of slandering others. While most of the parasha discusses laws connected to tzara'at, still the name of the parasha, Tazria, is connected to childbirth.

The pairing of subjects doesn't seem to make sense. Childbirth is potentially one of the most positive, joyful phenomena in our reality. After a healthy childbirth, a new life begins. However, tzara'at is a negative concept. A person afflicted with tzara'at had to leave Bne Yisrael's camp or, later, a city. A person with tzara'at was compared to a dead person. How could such opposite human experiences be discussed within the same parasha?

A main facet of Judaism is that punishment is not intended as retribution. Punishments from the Torah or from Hashem are not about returning harm for the harm caused by the sin. The popular concept of "an eye for an eye" misunderstands and misrepresents the original Jewish thought. Rather, punishments in Judaism are instructive lessons offered for the sinner's potential benefit. Difficulties and challenges offer an opportunity for change and improvement. The suffering inherent in difficulty helps to cleanse our soul and atone, and may bring us close to Hashem once again.
