Rabbi's Message

Shalom U'vracha,

This week's parasha introduces one of the greatest divisive forces ever to oppose Moshe. Moshe had already faced many difficult situations in

his life. A tyrant like Pharoah. The scouts who disastrously discouraged the Jewish people from entering Israel. But the challenge presented by Korah was unique.

Korah was Moshe's first cousin! His hatred of Moshe was very strong. His jealousy grew with Moshe's rise to leadership. Korah took his personal vendetta and used it to inflame the entire people against Moshe.

Korah was a man of repute. He was one of the Levites who carried the ark of Hashem. He was wealthy. Nevertheless, all his possessions and honors weren't enough for him. He had a vision; it revealed that the great prophet Samuel would

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come from his offspring. This knowledge emboldened him. He believed that he could challenge Moshe and become the leader of the nation. Although Korah was spiritually connected, he strayed away from the path of truth.

The Torah hints at Korah's loss of direction in the verse: "Now Korah took himself." The situation is also reflected in Solomon's words: "A brother offended is more formidable than a fortified city." Korah was like a "brother offended," when he revolted against Moshe. Korah claimed that Moshe's transmission of Hashem's teachings and words was false. He claimed that Moshe was just trying to gain more honor and greatness for himself.

The entire nation had witnessed countless miracles, culminating with Hashem's revelation of his presence to the entire nation at Mount Sinai: "I am Hashem your Lord who took you out of the land of Egypt." However, they were still swayed by Korah's lies. This predicament teaches us how powerful a lie can be. Even when it's clear that a statement is completely false, the negative energy of the statement is enough to make someone feel differently about the person being slandered.
