which emphasizes the importance of our unity as a nation, before Rosh Hashanah. In this Torah portion we are told, "You are all strongly standing this day before Hashem... that you may enter Hashem's covenant which He is

making with you this day, in order to establish you this day as His people."

The covenant, an agreement and a commitment, underlies our deep, inner connection with Hashem, a connection which penetrates the essence of our souls. The verse above describes ten types of people who embody our whole nation. Only when we are all represented within our nation do we become complete.

Our unity empowers us and allows us to enter this covenant with Hashem, because Hashem appreciates unity and peace among us just as parents love seeing harmony and cooperation among their children. Hashem constantly re-enters the covenant with us anew. Recommitting anew to the covenant in each and every moment unites the people of Israel, deeply and powerfully, in community.

Moreover, our deep union increases the blessings we receive from Hashem. We become stronger, both as individuals and as a people, and become capable of standing securely during the judgment of the upcoming year that occurs during Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

Our union in community strengthens our prayers, lifting them up high. Hashem chooses to forgive all our misdeeds when he sees that we are striving for peace and forgiveness. As we are told, "Hashem found no vessel better to hold 'blessings' than 'Shalom'," in other words, a peaceful community makes us capable of containing blessings.

This Shabbat is also Shabbat Mevarchim, when we bless the upcoming month of Tishrei. However, we don't recite the customary prayer this month, since Hashem himself blesses the month of Tishrei. The Torah calls Tishrei the seventh month, or "Shevii" which means "seventh" in Hebrew. The word "shevii" resembles the Hebrew word "sovah", which means "fullness and satiety".
