### **Rabbi's Message**

Shalom U'vracha,

This Shabbat is called "Shabbat Shuvah" or the Shabbat of returning, because it precedes Yom Kippur.

This year, we read Parashat Vayelech in which the nation of Israel nears the end of 40 years journeying in the desert. During our week's Torah portion, Moshe gives his final commandments to the nation. He also transfers leadership to Joshua who will now lead the nation into the land of Israel. Moshe exhorts Joshua and Israel to be "chazak ve'ematz" or "strong and courageous" as they go forth without him. He blesses Joshua as a leader, and blesses all the people so that they remain devoted to Hashem's ways.

Later, Moshe seemingly repeats some of what he's said to Joshua; he again states, "you will bring [the nation] into the land." However, in the repeated phrase, there is a slight variation in the Hebrew word for 'bring'. The first time the verb form suggests that Joshua will not operate alone. Rather, he will be bringing the nation together with others, the elders of the nation. In other words, when he first speaks, Moshe implies that Joshua must always take the elders' opinions into account. The second time, when Moshe repeats this phrase, he changes the verb form slightly, suggesting that Joshua alone will bring the nation to the land of Israel. Between the first and second speech, Moshe apparently corrected himself. Hashem had decreed that Joshua would be the sole leader. So, the second time Moshe speaks, when he tells Joshua, "you will bring [the nation] into the land", Moshe's chooses a slightly different form of "bring". This change suggests that Joshua alone will lead. In altering the verb slightly, Moshe empowers Joshua deeply.

Why? Upon entering the land of Israel, the people needed a strong leader who would command respect so that the nation would follow and also be strong and united. Divided leadership would leave too much place for the nation to challenge Joshua. Yet The Torah still mentions and includes Moshe's original phrase, the one which implies that Joshua must defer to the elders. This demonstrates the validity and truth of this position as well.


