story of Jacob leaving his home: "Yaakov left Be'er Sheva and went to Haran." As he left, Jacob may well have prayed a prayer similar to one found in Psalms, or *Tehillim*, 121: "A song of ascents, I

lift my eyes up to the mountains, from where will my help come?" Here "the mountains" could represent Jacob's parents who taught him and raised him. Jacob may well have felt unsupported. He could have thought to himself, "When Eliezer went on the mission to get Rebecca he left with ten camels laden with riches. I have not even one ring or bracelet!" Eisav remained at home, with all the support of his family, while Yaacov was forced to leave.

Jacob strengthened himself, renewing his faith in Hashem, maintaining hope in his Creator. In the words of Psalm 121: "My help comes from Hashem. He will not let my feet falter, my protector shall not sleep." Jacob trusted Hashem to guard him amid the troubles he experienced with Eisav and Lavan.

We associate Jacob with the evening prayer. The morning and afternoon prayers, which are connected to Avraham and Isaac, are prayed when there is still light out. The evening prayer is uttered when it is dark outside. For this reason, Jacob represents the power to bring light into the darkness.
